Emergency Lockdown Procedures

For some time now we have been developing our emergency procedures to lock school down in the event of a serious incident on site or in the local area. As part of this plan, we have to practice the procedures with the children in the event of a lockdown protocol being enforced, so that we can ensure our plan is robust, and iron out any issues in advance of needing the protocol for real. I will be sharing the procedures with children in assembly and these will then be reinforced and 'walked-through' by class teachers.

Every care will be taken for the children's wellbeing and they will be reassured that this practise, similar to that of a fire, is unlikely to be needed but must be practised regularly so that everyone knows where to go and what to do. Then in the event of a serious incident we will be able to do our very best at keeping all children and adults safe. I will keep the reasons for needing to lock school down to the children in the less sinister realms of an escaped animal in distress, dangerous weather conditions, civil disturbance, fire or flood in the community.
